

Whereas Francis Dove William Wiggan and Edward Samway Each of them purchas'd five hundred acres of land in this Province whereof (viz. of the whole 1500) they took up Eight hundred and sixty acres on or Near Neshannock Creek and twenty four acres in the City Liberties the Remainder being six hundred and sixteen acres was Survey'd and Laid out the 10th of the 6th 1709 by a Warr.^t from the Com^{rs} of Property Dated the 21st of the first Month 1708⁹ Situate near Southampton in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Great black Oak at Evan Griffith Corner from then West four Degrees North by the Land of Evan Griffith and Joseph Webb five hundred and six Poles to a post Then North by East by George Millards Land One hundred Ninety seven ^{Poles to a} post by a small hickrey Then East four Degrees South by John Clarks Land and Daniel Whorleys Land five hundred and Six Poles to a Corner post Then South by West by the ~~the~~ lands of John Clark and Stephen Whiting One hundred Ninety seven Poles to the place of Beginning Containing as above 616 acres Returned into the Secretarys Office April 15th 1717
