*At the Request of James Logan That We would Grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land Originally Purchased of the Proprietor by Henry Geary of Chestnut in the County of Bucks Yeoman by Deeds of Lease & Release bearing date the 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> days of April 1682 and now Convey'd to the s<sup>d</sup> James by Henry Geary of Wigentown in y<sup>e</sup> County of Hertford to whom the said Land came by Inheritance: These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said James Logan in the Right aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed (deducting y<sup>e</sup> proportion due to the said Purchase in y<sup>e</sup> City Liberties) the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd or taken up or is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1712*
