Laid out in the Year 1687

Whereas in pursuance of an Ord^r of the Court of ~~Kings~~ there was survey'd unto William Jacobs a certain Tract of Land containing two hundred Acres Situate near ~~to~~ or adjoining to that Plot of Ground now laid out for the City Philadelphia w^{ch} Said Land because of the situation of the s^d City the said William could not hold but was by the Prop^{rs} Warr^t bearing date y^e 16th of y^e 2^d Moth 1683 allow'd to take up the same quantity elsewhere which notwithstanding was never taken up or laid out to him, So that to this time he has not (as he alleges recvd any manner of Satisfaction for his disappointment in the Said Land but now has agreed to take four hundred Acres in lieu thereof where it may be found vacant. These therefore are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said William Jacob the Said quantity of four hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the fifteenth day of the 12th Moth 1708
