

By virtue of a Warrant from Edward Shippen Thomas Story and James Logan the Proprietary and Governors Commissioners of Property dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> Month 1701 for Resurveying unto Griffith Owen two parcels of land laid out to him in the Welch Tract Then one for one hundred fifty Six acres and a half the other for two hundred and forty Five acres to be Resurveyd in one Tract containing in the whole four hundred and one acres & a half Resurveyd unto the said Griffith Owen the 11<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> moob 1702 Seven hundred & seventy five acres of land in Goshert in the Welch Tract beginning at a post at the corner of Rowland Ellis his land and Extending by the said land South South east two hundred ninety eight perches to a post Then by Richard Streads land west South west ninety four perches to a post Then by the said Streads land South South east one hundred and twenty two perches to a post Then West south west thirty eight perches to a black oak Thence by <sup>late of</sup> Hugh Roberts land and Godwallader Ellis his land North north west nine hundred perches to a post Thence East northeast one hundred thirty two perches to a White oak from obl South South east Sixty perches to a post Thence East north east forty perches to the beginning
