



In pursuance of a warrant from the Trustees for the free Society bearing Date the 25 day of March in the year 1724 Surveyd This Tract of Land in Warminster TownShipp in the county of Bucks Beginning at a Black oak standing in the County Line and then north west one hundred and Sixten perch along the county Line to a post then North East three hundred and Eighteen perches by Nicolas Gilberts Land to a Spanish oak Then South East on hundred and Sixten perches by Land Late Thomas Shuts to a Small Spanish oak then South west three hundred and Eighteen perches by Henry English Land to the place of Beginning containing two hundred and thirty acres and on half and Eight perches Surveyd the 26 day of the Seventh month in the Year 1725 by

The above was Returned into the Secretary's Office the 16th of May 1726 for --- 218 acres with 6 per Cent added --- 12 --- 230 acres
