Whereas the Members of the free Society of Traders in Penn-  
sylvania having purchased Twenty thousand Acres of  
 Land in this Province Our late proprietary and Govern<sup>r</sup>  
 William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> Granted them his Warrant dated the  
 twenty sixth day of the twelfth Month 1682 directed to the  
 then Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> requiring him to Cause the Same to be  
 Survey'd or laid out to the s<sup>d</sup> Society By Vertute Whereof  
 Some part of the s<sup>d</sup> land was Survey'd and the Residue  
 remains unlocated and Whereas by an Act of Generall  
 Assembly of this Province all the s<sup>d</sup> Lands with the Apur-  
tenances are Vested & Settled in us as Trustees with power to  
 Sell the Same for the use of the s<sup>d</sup> Society And we having  
 Sold John Warder of of the City of Philadelphia One hundred  
 Acres of the s<sup>d</sup> Unlocated Land and in Pursuance of the Di-  
 rections of the s<sup>d</sup> Act of Assembly have Settled and adjusted in  
 the Survey<sup>r</sup> Generals office of this Province the true Amount  
 of the lands Already Survey'd and laid out in Right of the s<sup>d</sup>  
 Society and Secured the payment of the Arrears of Quitrent due for  
 the Same to the proprietor of this province These are Therefore to request  
 thee In pursuance of the affors<sup>d</sup> Original Warrant of the s<sup>d</sup> Late  
 Proprietary and by the Authority of the s<sup>d</sup> Act of Gen<sup>l</sup> Assembly  
 to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the s<sup>d</sup> John Warder Accord-  
 ing to the Established & Usual Methods heretofore practised  
 for taking up of Lands in this province and not otherwise the  
 s<sup>d</sup> Quantity of one Hundred Acres and make Return thereof  
 into the s<sup>d</sup> Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> office Given under our hands & Seals  
 at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of February Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1729/5
