Whereas the Members of y^e free Society of Traders in Pennsylvania having purchased Twenty thousand Acres of Land in this Province Our late Proprietary & Govern^r W^m Penn Esq^r Granted them his Warrant dated y^e Twenty sixth day of the Twelfth Month 1682 directed to y^e then Survey^r Gen^l requiring him to Cause y^e same to be Survey^d or laid out to the s^d Society by Vertue whereof some part of the s^d Land was Survey^d & y^e residue remains unlocated Now for as much as by an Act of Gen^l Assembly of this Province All the s^d Lands with y^e Appurtenances are Vested & settled in us as Trustees with Power to sell the same for the Use and Benefit of the s^d Society In pursuance of which Trust We have by Vertue of y^e s^d Act Sold to John Jones Six Hundred _____ Acres of the s^d Unlocated Land— Therefore we do hereby Impower and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey^d to the s^d John Jones ~~Better~~ the full quantity of six Hundred _____ Acres of the s^d Land not yet Located or Survey^d and make Return of y^e Survey thereof and Duly enter y^e same in the Survey^r Gen^l's office at Philadelphia And for so doing this and the s^d Act of Assembly shall be thy Sufficient warrant Given under our hands & Seals this fourth _____ Day of April One Thousand Seven hundred & twenty four
