Whereas the members of the free Society of Traders in Pennsylvania  
 Having purchased Twenty Thousand Acres of Land in this Province  
 Our late proprietary and Govern<sup>r</sup> William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> Granted them  
 his Warrant Dated the Twenty Sixth day of the twelfth Month 1682.  
 directed to the then Survey<sup>r</sup>-Gen<sup>l</sup> Requiring him to cause the  
 same to be survey'd or laid out to the sd Society By virtue whereof  
 some part of the sd land was Survey'd and the Residue remains  
 Unlocated And Whereas by an Act of Gen<sup>l</sup>-Assembly of this  
 Province All the sd Lands with the Appurtenances are vested and  
settled in us as Trustees with power to Sell the same for the use  
 of the sd Society And we having Sold Thomas Fitzwater of the  
 County of Philad<sup>e</sup> Three hundred acres of the sd Unlocated  
 Land and in pursuance of the directions of the sd Act of As-  
 sembly have settled and adjusted in the Survey<sup>r</sup>-Gen<sup>l</sup>'s office of  
 this Province the true account of the lands already Survey'd and  
 laid out in Right of the sd Society and Secured the payment of the  
 arrears of Quittrents due for the same to the proprietary of this  
 province

These are therefore to request thee in pursuance of the aforesd Original  
 Warrant of the sd Late proprietary and by the Authority of the sd Act of  
 Gen<sup>l</sup>-Assembly to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the sd Thomas  
 Fitzwater according to the Established & usual Methods heretofore  
 practised for taking up of lands in this Province and not otherwise  
 the sd quantity of three hundred Acres and make Return thereof  
 into the Survey<sup>r</sup>-Gen<sup>l</sup>s office Given under our hands and Seals at  
 Philad<sup>e</sup> the fifteenth day of february Anno Domini 172<sup>4</sup>/<sub>5</sub>
