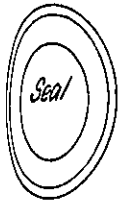


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Proprietaries.

Whereas Casper Wistar of the ~~County~~^{City} of Philadelphia hath requested that we would grant him to take up One thousand Acres of Land Situate in the Forks of Delaware, in four several Tracts — — — — in the County of Bucks — for which He agrees to pay to our Use the sum of Fifteen Pounds Ten Shillings current Money of this Province for every Hundred Acres, and the yearly Quit-rent of one Half-penny Sterling for every Acre thereof; THESE are therefore to authorize and require thee to Survey of course to be survey'd unto the said Casper Wistar at the place aforesaid, according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said Quantity of 1000 Acres, if not already survey'd or appropriated, and make Return thereof into the Secretary's Office, in order for further Confirmation; for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant; which survey, in case the said Casper Wistar fulfil the above agreement within Six Months from the Date hereof, shall be valid otherwise void. Given under my Hand, and the lesser Seal of our Province, at Philadelphia, this 2^d Day of August Anno Dom. 1738
