Beginning at a Hickery in a line of Robert Baker's Land thence North North West by Vacant Land 160 pches to a Black Oak thence West South West by Vacant Land 212 pches to a Spanish Oak thence South South East by Vacant Land 160 pches to a post thence East North East by the sa Robt Baker's Land 212 pches to the place of beginning Containing two hundred acres with the allowance of six acres p Cent
