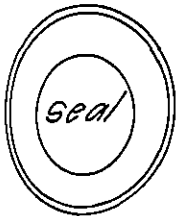


Pennsylvania ss.

By the Proprietaries

Upon an agreement made with Casper Wister of the City of Philadelphia for one Thousand Acres of Land to be laid out to him among the Unsurvey'd Lands in this Province, for which he has paid One hundred & fifty five Pounds Current Money, and further agrees to pay the ~~the~~ Yearly Quitrent of an half penny Sterling for every acre thereof forever hereafter These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Casper Wister back in the said Province According to the Method of Townships Appointed the said quantity of one Thousand Acres of Land (in four parcels) that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the Lesser Seal of our Said Province at Philadelphia the 10th day of y^e First Month (March)
