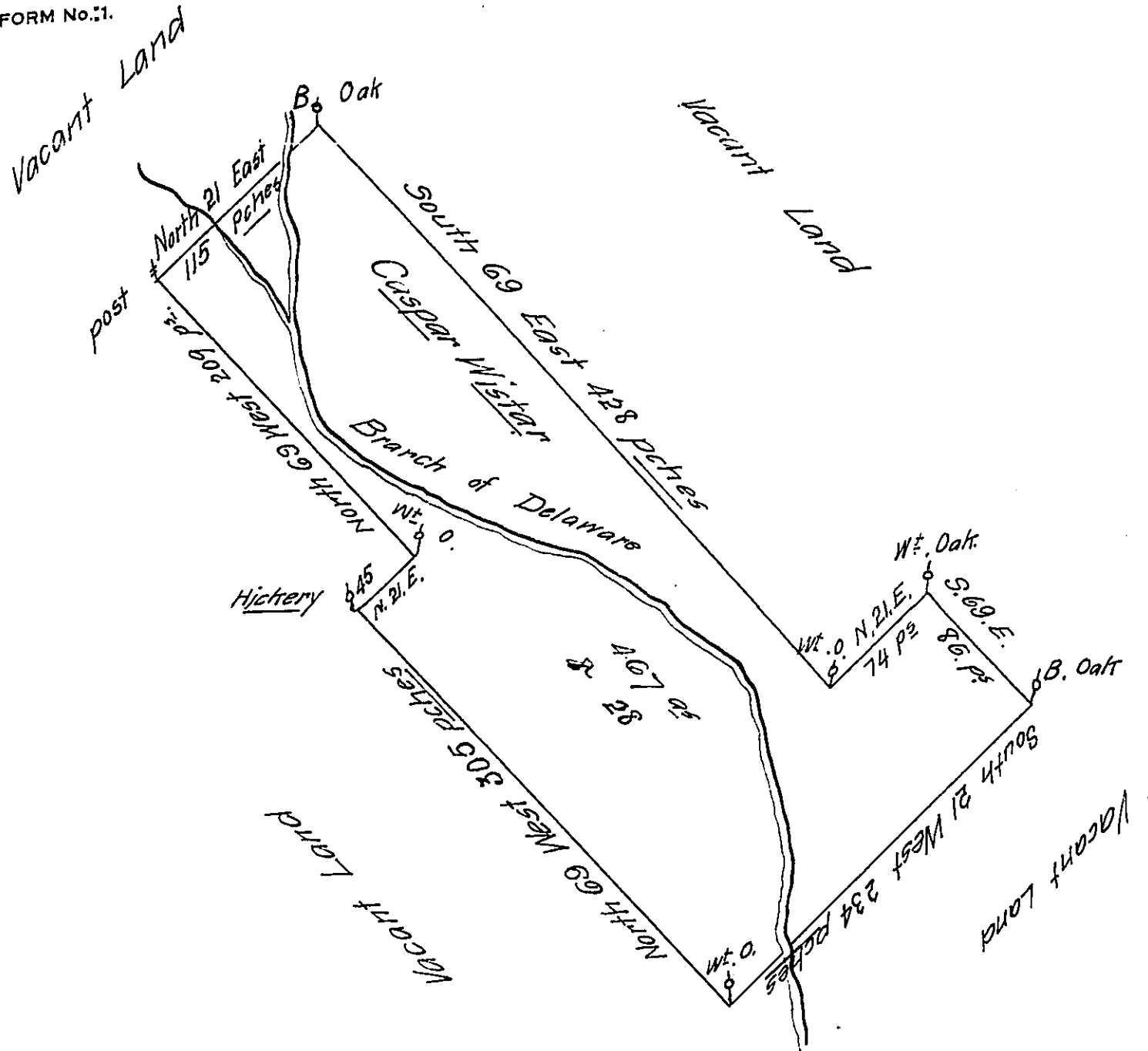


FORM No. 21.



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors dated the twenty third Day of April 1730 Surveyed and laid out for Caspar Wistar a Certain Tract of Land situate near Maxatawny on a Branch of Delaware River Beginning at a Black oak about six perches Eastward from the said Branch Thence extending South 69 Degrees East 428 pches to a White Oak Thence North 21 Degrees East 74 pches to a White oak Thence South 69 Degrees East 86 pches to a black Oak Thence South 21 Degrees West 234 pches to a white Oak Thence North 69 West 305 pches to a Hickery Thence North 21 East 45 pches to a White oak Thence North 69 Degrees West 209 pches to a post Thence North 21 Deg^s East 115 pches to the place of Beginning, being bounded on all Sides by vacant Land, Containing Four hundred & sixty seven Acres besides the Allowance of 6 p Cent.
