



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors dated the 23<sup>d</sup> day of April 1730 there was Surveyd unto Caspar Wister on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of October 1730 a certain Tract of land situate in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at an Ash Stump at a Corner of Edward farmer's land Thence extending by the said farmer's land and vacant land North East 340 perches to a post Thence South East 201 pches to a small black oak in a line of other land of the said Caspar Then by the same South West Sixteen pches and South East 54 pches to a White Oak at a Corner of his said other Tract in the line of Abraham Levari's land Then by said line South West 292 pches to a post in a line of John Kastner's land then by the said line North West 122 pches to a post Then South West by the said Kastner's land thirty two perches to an Alder Then by Isaac Turk's land North West 133 pches to the place of Beginning Containing four hundred and eighty three acres w<sup>th</sup> Allowance of Six p Cent
