



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors bearing Date the  
 twenty third Day of April 1730 There was Surveyed unto  
 Caspar Wistar a certain Tract of Land situate on a Branch of  
 Schoolkil ——— called Maxatawny in the County of Philadelphia  
 adjoining to other Land formerly Laid out to s<sup>d</sup> Caspar Beginning  
 at a small Hickery at a Corner of s<sup>d</sup> other Land Thence extending  
 by the same South ten Deg<sup>s</sup> East two hundred p<sup>s</sup> to a Post at another  
 Corner Thence North Eighty Deg<sup>s</sup> East one hundred & seven p<sup>s</sup> to a Post  
 Thence by Vacant Land as followeth South ten Deg<sup>s</sup> East Ninety Eight p<sup>s</sup> to a  
 Post South Eighty Deg<sup>s</sup> West two hundred thirty nine p<sup>s</sup> to a Post North ten  
 Deg<sup>s</sup> West Ninety two p<sup>s</sup> to a Post South Eighty Deg<sup>s</sup> West seventy eight p<sup>s</sup> to a  
 Post North ten Degrees West two hundred & six p<sup>s</sup> to a black oak and North  
 Eighty Degs East two hundred and ten p<sup>s</sup> to the place of Beginning  
 Containing Three hundred & Eighty seven Acres & half an acre besides  
 the usual allowance of 6 p Cent. for Roads and High ways  
 Surveyed y<sup>e</sup> 22<sup>d</sup> Feb<sup>r</sup> 1730/1
