By virtue of a Warrant Dated the 14th day of November, 1741. There was Surveyed to the Use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land Situate in the Forks of Delaware formerly in the County of Bucks now in the County of Northampton. Beginning at a marked black oak standing on the bank of Delaware River and from thence extending by Land laid out for the use of the said Honourable Proprietaries. West Four hundred and sixty six perches to a stone, thence by Jacob Freylick's Land North two hundred and thirty two perches to a Post, and West one hundred and twenty Perches to a post, thence by Daniel Worm's Land North fifty perches to a marked black oak, thence by Thomas Greame's Land East sixty three perches to a post, and north One hundred and twenty perches to a marked black oak, thence by Vacant Land East ninety two perches to a small white oak marked and South sixty degrees and a half East five hundred and Seventy five perches to a marked Birch tree standing on the bank of the said Delaware River thence down the same on the several courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing Nine Hundred acres and the usual allowance of six Acres. &c^t for Roads &c^a. Returned into the Secretary's Office the Second Day of January Anno Dom.: 1755.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eleventh day of May, 1910.
