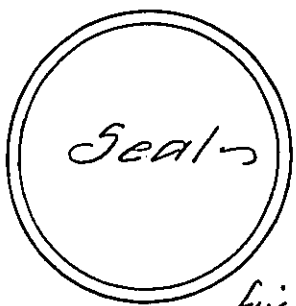


Pensilvania 5.5.



By the Commissioners of Property.  
 At the Request of Thomas Chalkley that we  
 would Grant him to take up within the City of  
 Philadelphia the Lot of Ground belonging to  
 five hundred Acres of Land the Original purchase  
 of John Jones late of London Deed and also the proportion  
 of Liberty Land belonging to the Same purchase. The  
 whole being now vested in the said Thomas by Deeds of  
 Lease & Release dated ye 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> days of September  
 Anno 1719 duly Executed under ye hand & Seal of Elizabeth<sup>th</sup>  
 Hilton only Sister & heir of the said John Jones. These  
 are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out  
 unto the said Thomas Chalkley the said lot of Ground on  
 Schuylkill Side of ye said City proportionably to the said  
 purchase and ye Liberty Land appurtenant to the Same  
 within the liberties of ye said City and make Returns  
 thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further  
 Confirmation. Given under our hands and the lesser  
 Seal of the Province at Philada. ye 5<sup>th</sup> day of Septembr.
