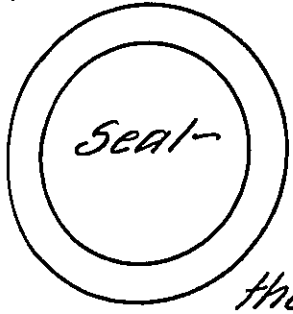


Pensylvania 5.5.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of James Steel of the City of Philadelphia that we would Grant him to take up the Lot of Ground within the said City and the proportion of Liberty Land within the Liberties thereof appurtenant and belonging to five hundred acres the Original purchase made of the late Proprietary William Penn Esqr. by William Boswell then of Southwark Potterer by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 10th & 11th days of Octobr. A. D. 1681. who by like Deeds dated the 31st of March & the 1st day of April last past Granted and Convey'd the whole unto the said James Steel. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey & lay out or cause to be Survey'd & laid out unto the said James Steel the said Lot of Ground within the said City where ye same may be found vacant as near as may be to the place where the said ^{Lot} fell by allotment and the proportion of Liberty Land where it can be found unsurvey'd and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office.
