

At the Request of James Steel we the Subscribers having on the Twenty first day of August 1739 viewed the Lines of a Certain Tract of Land Situate on the North East side of the River Schuylkill in ye County of Philadelphia Resurveyed to the said James Steel in Right of the Original purchase of William Markham In pursuance of a Warrant from the late Commissioners of property dated the 18th of September 1729 Do find the Said Tract of Land to be bounded by Lines of Trees which appear to us to be anciently marked, Beginning at a hickery near the said River at the upper End of an Old Settlement of the Mingo Indians. Thence North East Eight hundred perches to a marked black Oak at a Corner of Limerick Township thence by that part of ye Township of providence formerly called Telners South East Six hundred and ten perches to a Corner marked hickery Thence South West Seven hundred and Twenty perches to the said River then up the same to the Beginning And the said James Steel having shewed to us a Certificate of the Survey of a Tract of Land in the said County [made by verbal order] in the hand writing of Robert Longshore Dep. Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup>. And Returned by virtue of a warrant from the proprietors former Commissioners of property bearing date the ninth day of May 1689. unto the said William Markham and to Jacob Pellison computed to Contain Three Thousand five hundred Acres And according to our Judgment the above described Tract of Land [the Lines whereof we have carefully observed] is included within the bounds of the Tract of Land Returned by the said Robert Longshore.
