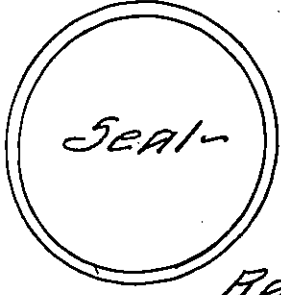


*Pensylvania S.S. By the Proprietaries.*



*Upon the Application and Request of Samuel Bonham of London. Surviving Trustee of the London Company by their Attorney William Rawle of Philadelphia, that We would be pleased to Grant them a Survey on the Quantity of Three Thousand Acres of Land yet remaining unsurveyed of the Original Purchase of Five Thousand Acres made by Indentures of Lease and Release of the Fourteenth and Fifteenth days of August 1682 of our late Father since deceased by Joshua Holland then of Chatham also deceased, the Right whereof being now vested in the London Company aforesaid. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Surveyed for the use of the said Company according to the Method of Townships Appointed [in two or three Tracts] the said Quantity of Three Thousand Acres of Land and make Return thereof into our Secretary's Office in Order for Confirmation and in so doing this shall be thy Sufficient warrant. Given under my hand and the Lesser Seal of our said Province at Philadelphia this Twentieth day of January Anno. Dom. 1737.*
