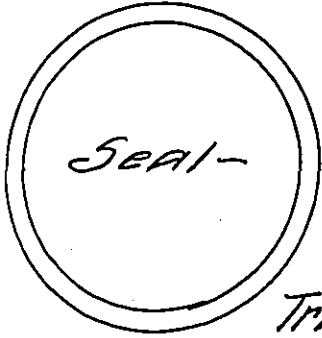


Pennsylvania s.s.

Upon the Request and Application of Samuel Bonham surviving Trustee of the Persons called the London Company owners of Sundry Tracts of Land and Lots within our Province and Counties to us made, by John Estough. Agent or Attorney in the Managemt. of their Affairs, relating to the same. That we would be pleased to grant our warrant for returning into our Secretary's Office All that Part of a large Tract of twenty five thousand two hundred Acres of Land to them belonging lying on the West Side of the circular Line which divides the Counties of Newcastle and Chester in Order to rectify a mistake in the Patent granted for the same wherein the whole Tract is mentioned to lye within the County of Newcastle when it appears that the greater Part thereof is within the County of Chester. These are therefore to Authorize and require thee to Certify into our Secretary's Office the Lines and Quantity of so much of the said Tract of Land which lyes on the West Side of the Circular Line within the County of Chester aforesaid in Order to rectify the saide Mistake by a further Confirmation of the said Land And for so Doing this shall be thy sufficient warrant Given under my Hand and the lesser Seal at Philadelphia this 18th Day of February Anno Domini 1736 To Benjamin Eastburr. Surveyr. Gentle. Tho. Penn.
