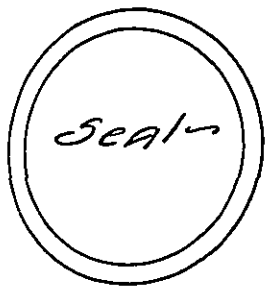


Pennsylvania s.s.

At the Request of Samuel Bonham Surviving
Trustee of the persons called the London Company
Purchasers of Land within our Province by their
Attorney William Rawle that we would be pleased to
grant them a Survey on the Quantity of twelve hundred
Acres of Land the Purchase of one Joseph Peckover made
of our late Father Willm. Penn Esqr. by Deeds of Lease and
Release dated the tenth and eleventh Days of the first
Month Anno 1694 and since by other Deeds the same
became vested in the said Company.

These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or
cause to be surveyed unto the sd Samuel Bonham for
the use of the said Company according to the Method of
Townships appointed the said Quantity of twelve hund-
red Acres of Land that has not been already surveyed
nor appropriated and make Return thereof into our
Secretary's Office in Order for Confirmation and for
so Doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given
under my Hand and the lesser Seal at Philadelphia
this 17th Day of May Anno Dni 1737.
