



Lay out 200 acres for Griff-Jones & Morris Wms beg. at Mulberry on Sculkill at ye mouth of Indian Creek y^e N.N.W. by ye line of lot M. to a black oak supposd 60 pole y^e N.E. along that lot line to a white oak abt 104 pole by my draft then still on ye same line untill you intersect y^e New road from Perqueamy (w^{ch} Road comes over Indian Creek at a place markd ^{& denoted below by A.} and is to run one strait course thence to intersect a line w^{ch} divides lot M. from lot J. 44 pole N.W. from ye black oak mark C at corn^r of lot J & lot K) then along ye sd road w^{ch} as I suppose will be about N. 75 E. [but find y^e course truly] so far as to set of y^e 200 acres in such Manner as may save ye Spring & Meadow wth land about it convenient for another setlem^t (noted D) and then bound on Sculkill to y^e ~~place~~ Mulberry tree
