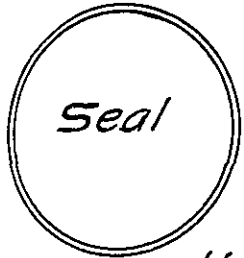


Pennsylvania Ss.

Upon the application and request of Thomas Kirton of Speen in the County of Berks in Great Britain by his Attorneys Isaac & Charles Norris of the City of Philad^a that we would be pleased to grant him a survey on the quantity of five hundred acres of land the original purchase made of our late ffather William Penn Esq^t (since deceased) by Thomas Sanders of Ilmore in the County of Bucks in Great Britain afores^d also deceased, by Deeds of Lease & release of 20th & 21st days of March in the Year of our Lord 1681 the right whereof as well by descent as other like deeds is now vested in the said Thomas Kirton.

These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Thomas Kirton according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred a^s of land and make return thereof into our Secretary's office in order for confirmation & in so doing this shall be thy sifficient Warrant.
