At the request of Joseph Turner of the City of Philadelphia Merch<sup>t</sup> that wee would grant him to take up the quantity of Four Thousand nine hundred & twenty Acres of Land, the original purchase made of our late deceased Father William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> by John and Ann Sharlott Lowther the right whereof by sundry mesue grants being now vested in the said Joseph Turner. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Joseph Turner, according to the method of Townships appointed, the said quantity of Four Thousand nine hundred & twenty Acres of Land (including one half of the Tract called the Mannor of Bilton) that hath not been already surveyed nor appropriated and make Return thereof into y<sup>e</sup> Secretarys office for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant, Given under my hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelphia the 31<sup>st</sup> day of Decem<sup>r</sup> Anno Dom. 1733.
