These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey and lay out or cause to be survey'd and laid out unto the said Joseph Turner within the said City the Lot of Ground and within the Liberties thereof the <sup>of</sup> ~~and~~ proportion Liberty Land that have not already been survey'd nor appropriated - make return of the same into the Secretarys Office in order for Confirmation Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelphia the 8<sup>th</sup> day of Decem<sup>r</sup> Anno Dom. 1733.
