Whereas upon a Computation of the Lands already surveyed and laid out in Right of the original purchase of Five Thousand Acres made by Lawrence Groudron the Elder (since deceased) there yet remains to be taken up and surveyed to compleat the said purchase the Quantity of Four hundred and twenty-four Acres which Lawrence Groudron, Grandson of the aforesaid Lawrence unto whom the said purchased Lands appertain now requests that we would be pleased to Grant our Warrant for the survey thereof.

These are therefore to authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Lawrence Groudron (the Younger) according to the method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of Four hundred and Twenty-four Acres of Land and make Return thereof into Our Secretary's Office in Order for Confirmation and in so doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant. Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelphia this 24th Day of November Anno Dom. 1737.
