



By virtue of a Warrant from Isaac Norris James Logan and Thomas Griffiths Commissioners of Property dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1730. There was Surveyd on the 11<sup>th</sup> of December 1730 unto William Allen a Tract of Land containing five hundred <sup>acres</sup> in Right of William Clark's original purchase of the said quantity; the said Tract situate above Warminster in the County of Bucks

Beginning at a black Oak in a line of Mercy Phillips Land and running by the same and the land of Joseph Hough north west three hundred sixty four perches to another black oak then southwest by a line of marked trees two hundred and twenty perches to a post Then southeast by a line of marked trees three hundred sixty four perches to a hickory tree then by a line of marked trees northeast two hundred and twenty perches to the place of beginning containing five hundred acres as aforesaid —

Contains ~~473~~<sup>480</sup> acres besides the allowance of 6<sup>as</sup> % Cent. for Roads & Highways. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 24<sup>th</sup> of July 1734.

Wants ~~19~~<sup>12<sup>as</sup></sup> to Compleat the Quantity purchased by W<sup>m</sup> Clark.
