By the Commissioners of Property
At the Request of James Steel of the City of
Philadelphia that we would grant him to take
up the quantity of two hundred & fifty Acres of
Land in part of five hundred Acres the Original purchase
made of the late Proprietary William Penn Esqr. by
William Boswell ^{them} - of Southwark Poulterer by Deeds of
Lease & Release dated the 10th & 11th days of October
Anno 1681 who by like Deeds dated ye 31st of March and the
1st day of April East past granted & convey'd the whole
unto the said James Steel. These are to Authorize & Re-
quire thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said
James Steel according to the Method of Townships appoint-
ed the quantity of two hundred & forty two Acres of Land
[the other eight ^{Acres} being allow'd to be laid out in the Liberties
of Philadelphia] that has not been already Survey'd nor
Appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make
Return thereof into the Secretarys Office Given under
our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at
Philadelphia the 30th day of Octobr. Anno Dni 1730.
