

John Penn Thomas Penn & Richard Penn Esq^{rs} True and Absolute Proprietaries of the Province of Pennsylvania and counties of New Castle Kent and Sussex on Delaware-To Jacob Taylor Surveyor General or to Our Surveyor General for the Time being.

Whereas by an agreement made between us the said proprietors, the said Thomas Penn is to have surveyed to him for his own proper use and benefit five thousand acres of Land in Our Said Province.

This is therefore to authorize and require you to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Thomas Penn his heirs & assigns five thousand acres of our said Land according to the custom of the said province. Reserving unto us and our heirs one shilling quitrent for each hundred acres

Given under Our hands and the Lesser Seal of the said Province at London May the 18th 1732.
