Upon an Agreement made with James Steel our Receiver General; These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto him the said James Steel the North part of the Square of Ground lying on the South Side of Spruce Street between the broad Street and the Eighth Street from the River Schuylkill in the said City being in breadth on the said broad Street One Hundred and Two Feet, and in length on Spruce Street Three Hundred and Ninety Six Feet for which he is forthwith to Pay to our use Twenty Five Pounds Money of Pennsylvania and the Quitrent of Two Shillings Sterling for the same. And also to Resurvey or cause to be Resurveyed unto him the said James Steel the South part of the said Square of Ground lying between the broad Street and the Eighth Street from the River Schuylkill aforesaid and bounding the same on the South with Pine Street and make Return of the whole Square into our Secretary's Office in Order for Confirmation and for so doing this shall be thy Sufficient warrant Given under my Hand and the lesser Seal at Philadelphia this 30th Day of July Anno Dom. 1736.
