To the Honorable the House of Propriety of the Commonwealth
 of Pennsylvania. The petition of James Gray Humbly sheweth
 That your Petitioner inherited unto the American Service
 in 1776 in the Fifth Pennsylvania Regiment commanded by Col.
 Spotswood, afterwards by Col. Morgan, May following was drafted
 into Col. Morgan's Rifle men. In 1778 again the aforesaid Fifth
 Regiment was again drafted into General Washington's foot
 Guards, then continued till after the capturing of General Cornwallis
 about five years and three months; therefore from the service
 rendered conceive my self entitled to donation land, which I
 humbly submit to the Honorable Board.
