officers and Soldiers enlisted in the army of the
United States to serve during the war, who are
to be Discharged on the conclusion of the Definitive
Treaty of Peace —

The bearer hereof William Donnerly of
Capt John Christy's company of the 3^d Penn^a Regt
has Permission to return to his Place of abode
with his arms and accoutrements, Clothing &c
and if called on by Congress before the conclusion
of said Definitive Treaty, he is to repair to the
 Rendezvous of said Regiment where ever it may
be ~~at the time~~ ~~to be assigned~~ ~~in a~~ ~~Quarter~~
but in case he is not call'd on above this will
be his Legal Discharge on the conclusion of
the Definitive Treaty of Peace —
