Other Indentures made this 2^o day of May in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and ninety six, by and between George Jones
on the one part and George Taylor on the other part witnesses to
that the said George Jones having found with the end of the late
War as a Soldier in Capt. Boyd's Company of Rangers, and having
applied to the Secretary's Office within the limited time, for two
hundred acres Land which said Justice entitled him to from the
State of Pennsylvania - and at the same time the said George Jones
applied for two hundred acres of Land for the Widow and Heir of
his Father William Jones, who was entitled from having served
in the same manner and in the same Company with his
son George Jones - The Widow Elizabeth Jones by an Instrument
of writing bearing date the 4th day of April 1796 has conveyed
all her right title and interest in and to the above two
hundred acres of Land to her son George Jones one of the
parties to this Instrument - Now know ye that I George Jones,
for a valuable consideration to me in hand paid the receipt
whereof I do hereby acknowledge, for myself my heirs Executors
Administrators & assigns have granted, Bargained, sold released
and confirmed both the above described Tracts of Land viz
that conveyed to me by Elizabeth Jones and that which I am
entitled to from the State, unto George Taylor of Philadelphia his
heir and assigns forever, with full power to ask demand
due for and receive the same from this Commonwealth
in the same full and ample manner as I might or
could do myself in testimony whereof I have hereunto
