 more than five pounds for pay more than he ever received
 any allowance for appreciation, nor donation lands
 whatever. The History now makes his application
 to the Department of Accounts of Pennsylvania
 for the receipt of pay and the appreciation of pay
 due to him, if not foreclosed, and also for his portion
 of the donation lands, allotted to the Pennsylvania
 Line in the American Army, and humbly requests
 that his his Application may be duly filed among
 the Records of the Department aforesaid. — Done at
 July the 4. 1858 in the twenty fourth year of
 our glorious Independence. —
