Do make constitute and appoint Alexander Turner of Chanceford Township aforesaid Esquire, my true and lawful Attorney for me and in my Name to apply for at the proper Offices and ask demand obtain and receive a Patent or Grant of Confirmation of all the Donation Lands due to me, and which I am intitled unto by or under the Laws of the State of Pennsylvania, as a Bounty for Military Services by me performed in the late War with America also an Attorney or Attorneys under him for that Purpose to make and substitute, and to do all lawful Acts requisite for effecting the Premises; hereby ratifying and confirming all that my said Attorney or his Substitute shall lawfully do in and about the Premises by Virtue of these Presents.
