the State of Pennsylvania has Allowed us as the Children
of Elias McKay Deceased, late Col. of the 8th Pennsylvania
Army and granting unto our said Attorney, by these presents
our full and whole Power, Strength and Authority, in and
about the Premises, to transact, use and take, all lawful ways
and means in our Name for the receiving thereof and for
the receipt of such Lands, Acquittances, or other sufficient
Discharges, for us and in our Name, to make seal and deliver
and generally all and every other act and acts, Things and Things
Done or Devices, in the Law whatsoever, needfull and necessary
to be done in and about the Premises for us and in our Name
to do execute and perform, in fully and amply to all intents and
Purposes as the might or law do, if we were personally present
in or as if the Matter required more special Authority than is here given
our Attorney one or more times here for the purpose aforesaid to
make and constitute, and again at pleasure to revoke, dissolve, annul and
revoke, for firm and effectual, all and whatsoever our said Attorney shall
lawfully do in about the Premises, by Deeds hereof. In Witness hereof
