 whole power, strength & Authority, in and about the Premises to have
 Use and take all lawful ways and Means, In my Name for the purposes
 aforesaid, and upon Receipts of the aforesaid Deeds or Patents
 Acquittances, or other sufficient Discharges, for me, and in my name
 to make, seal and deliver for the Premises aforesaid. Hereby testifying
 allowing and holding for firm and effectual, All and whatsoever my
 said Attorney shall lawfully do in and about the Premises aforesaid -
 by virtue of these presents - In Witness whereof I have hereunto
