Know all Men by these Presents, That I Peter Mungel  
 of Wyddelburg Township, in the County of Bucks and State of Pennsyl-  
 -vania, Miller, Have made, ordained, constituted & appointed  
 and by these Presents do make, ordain, constitute & appoint for  
 Heirs of the Borough of Reading, in the said County, within  
 my true and lawful Attorney, for me, and in my name, and for  
 my use, to take out a Patent, <sup>for the said land</sup> which shall or may be arising and  
 becoming, to Michael Malyin, late a Soldier in the third Pennsyl-  
 -vania Regiment, commanded by Colonel A. Butler, Esquire,  
 and by the said Michael Malyin granted and sold to me the said  
 Peter Mungel, by deed well dated the thirty first day of March Anno  
 Domini 1746: And upon the receipt of the said Patent to give  
 a release or other discharge testifying the receipt thereof. Giving &  
 by these Presents granting unto my said Attorney, full power  
 and authority to do, or cause to be done, all and every such Acts  
 Acts, Things and Things whatsoever shall or may be necessary &  
 needful to be done, in, and about the Premises, in as full and  
 ample manner, as I myself might or could do, was I personally  
 present at the doing of the same. And one or more Attornies under  
 him to substitute, and again at pleasure to revoke, ratifying &  
 allowing all and whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully do  
 or cause to be done, in, and about the Premises by virtue of these  
 Presents. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
 Hand & Seal, the eighteenth day of April, in the Year of our Lord  
 one thousand, seven hundred and sixty six.
