 presents do make ordain and constitute and in our place and stead put  
 in full trust and confidence, friend Isaac Harlett of Commonwealth of  
 Pennsylvania, our true and lawful  
 attorney for us and in our names to ask and demand and receive at the  
 proper offices of this commonwealth all that donation of land which  
 the said Joseph O'Hara was entitled to for his services by virtue of law  
 of said commonwealth in such cases made and provided, and also all  
 arrears of pay & which may be justly due the said Joseph O'Hara as  
 a soldier for his services aforesaid giving and granting unto our said  
 attorney our full and whole power strength and authority to take all  
 lawful ways and means in our names for the purposes aforesaid acquit  
 or other sufficient discharges for us and in our names to make Seal and  
 deliver In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and Seals
