Before me the subscriber one of the Justices of the peace in and for said county came Arthur O'Hara who on his solemn oath doth depose and say that his brother Joseph O'Hara enlisted at Bedford in the State of Pennsylvania under Captain John Wilkins in the year 1777 to serve in the American Service during the war with Great Britain that said Joseph O'Hara died in the service and that Mary O'Hara widow and William O'Hara her son are the only surviving heirs of said Joseph O'Hara and further saith not sworn and subscribed the the fourth day of Novr 1803
