And I do by these presents ordain, constitute and depute you, the said

administrators of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits, which were of the said deceased, within the limits aforesaid, saving harmless, and for ever indemnifying me, and all other officers, against all persons, by reason of your administration aforesaid, and saving all other their rights, &c.
