he was well acquainted with a Certain John Skilling
and that he served in Capt Thomas Robisons Company
of Northumberland Rangers, having also been taken
prisoner by the Indians, Delivered over to the English
and by them sent home on parole, as soon as he returned
joined the said Company and after served as a soldier
in said Company regularly untill the End of the
war and got his Discharge of which said Company
I was a regular Soldier, and also Obtained my Discharge
and further saith not. Only that I do Depose and
further say that there was no other John Skilling in
said Company but himself nor never knew any
John Skilling as a Soldier but himself, and that there
was no such man in said Company of the Name
of John Skilling - Sworn and Subscribed before
