listed in Captain Pikes Company in the second British
regiment and was stationed in the H. H. Regiment of
House and that he recd. during the last, and that
he never gave any other Power of Attorney than the
One he gave Joseph Davis, for the land now known by
the State, and that he never sold nor conveyed the same
to any other person, then the said Joseph Davis, and
further he saith not, Witness his own hand bearing
the day and year aforesaid.
