KNOW all Men by these Presents, That I

Thomas Sullivan of York County State of Penna  
 a Late Soldier in the Pennsylvania Line in the  
 Second Regiment Commanded by Colonel

For full Value received, Do make, constitute and appoint William Lane of Philadelphia  
 my true and lawful Attorney for me and in my Name and Stead, but for the sole

Use of him the said William Lane is Heirs and Assigns forever:  
 To ask, demand and receive, and by all lawful Ways and Means recover all or any Sums of MONEY or  
 CERTIFICATES that may be due, owing or payable to, or detained from me and also all Lands  
 Due me as a Soldier by the United States or the State of Pennsylvania, or by any Person  
 acting under their Authority: And to receive all my Depreciation of Pay to which I am entitled by an Act  
 of the General Assembly, passed the \_\_\_\_\_ for settling  
 the Depreciation of Pay due to the Pennsylvania Line for their Services in the late War, that I may be  
 hereafter entitled to by any subsequent Act or Acts of the United States, or the State of Pennsylvania for services render-  
 ed as aforesaid, or by any other lawful means, giving unto my said Attorney my whole Power, Right, and Authority,  
 in and about the Premises, to use and take all lawful Ways and Means in my Name and behalf to Recover the same,  
 with power also to appoint one or more Attornies under him for the purpose aforesaid, by Ratifying, Allowing and  
 confirming whatsoever my said Attorney shall do by Virtue of these Presents.
