Now know ye, that the said Cooper for and in consideration of a new grant, provided for, by an Act of the General Assembly of this Commonwealth, passed the twenty eighth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six, in an act for the relief of John Cummins and William Cooper, hath renounced, released, and for ever quit, and by these presents, release, and forever quit claim unto the said Commonwealth, All the estate title, interest, property, claim and demand whatsoever of the said William Cooper, in law or equity, or otherwise, of, in, to or out of the said within described Tract or parcel of Land To have and to hold all and singular the premises renounced and released, or mentioned and intended so to be, with the appurtenances, unto the said Commonwealth for ever.
