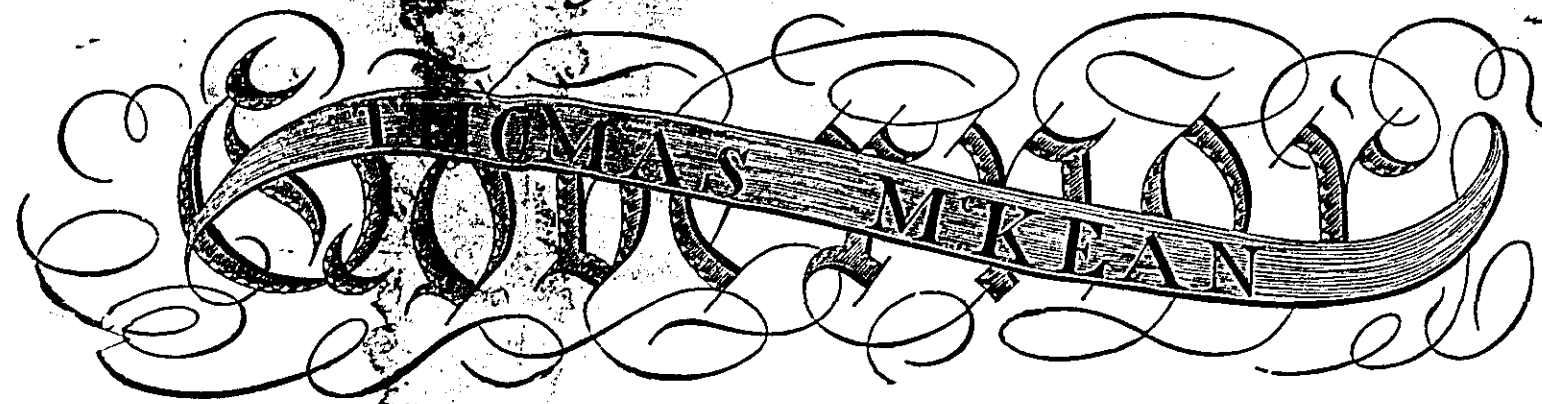

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Know ye,

That in consideration of the services rendered by Richard Ennis private in the late Army of the United States there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Mary Ennis widow of the said Richard Ennis dec'd a certain

Tract of land No 238 called "Mary's Lot" Situate in donation District No 2, in Butler County beginning at a black Oak

the district line No 3, West two hundred sixty one perches to a black Oak, thence by No 270, South one hundred thirty perches to a black Oak, by No 239, East two hundred sixty one perches to a white Oak, and thence by vacant land, North one hundred thirty perches to a black Oak, containing Two hundred Acres and Allowance of six ff^t Cont four roads 80^t, which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed 21th February 1785.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances, unto the said Mary Ennis and her Heirs to the use of her the said Mary Ennis her Heirs and assigns forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents, or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be hereunto affixed, at Lancaster this twenty seventh day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three and of the Commonwealth the twenty seventh.
