Know ye,

That in consideration of the services rendered by Cornelius Huffman private in the late Army of the United States - there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Cornelius Huffman a certain Tract of land No. 2, situate in Donalson District No. 2, in Butler County beginning at a post thence by No. 220 East two hundred perches to a black Oak, thence by No. 221 South one hundred thirty perches to a black Oak, thence by No. 222 West one hundred thirty perches to a white Oak, and thence by No. 223 North one hundred thirty perches to the Beginning, containing 2 Acres, and Allowance of six ft. land for roads &c. (Which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of Assembly passed 24th February 1785.)

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Cornelius Huffman and his Heirs to the use of him the said Cornelius Huffman and his Heirs forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fee simple of Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the Commonwealth to be hereunto affixed, at Lancaster this second day of March - in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three - and of the Commonwealth the twenty-seventh.
