

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Now ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Richard Slespivale, in the late Army of the United States and Pennsylvania Line - there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Mary Woodrow daughter of the said Richard Slespivale, certain land or called "Recompence Settlement in donation District No. 2, in Butler County, Beginning at a black Oak thence by N^o 2 two hundred sixty one perches to a black Oak thence by N^o 3 10. South one hundred thirty perches to a Chestnut, thence by N^o 2 70. East two hundred sixty one white Oak, and thence by N^o 4 150. due west to a Chestnut, and return by N^o 2 74. both one hundred thirty perches to the continuing line hundred. Reserving a burthen of six p[er]cent for roads &c. which said land was granted in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed January 1st 1808, and the same recited here in full, to wit, wherein his estate descended to his daughter in the said Richard Slespivale by law.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Mary Woodrow and her heirs to the use of her the said Mary Woodrow her heirs forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the Pitt's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these presents, at Lancaster - this fifth - day of April - in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred thirteen, and of the Commonwealth the twenty-ninth.

Know all men by these presents, that I John M. Miller in whom the right title to the above Land, by means of sundry conveyances, duly executed, for & in consideration of another lot of two hundred acres of land being granted to me, by the Land Office of the State of Pennsylvania, agreeably to Law, do grant, convey, and surrender unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania all my right title, and interest in & to the land described tract of land with the appurtenances, bounded to hold the same to the only proper use & other office of the Commonwealth forever.
