To all to whom these Presents shall come GREETING:

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by *Peter Lunckle Private* in the late army of the United States

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said *Peter Lunckle*

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland

In the Tenth district of donation Lands Beginning at a Sugar Tree the Numbered Corner and running East by Lot No 2000 two hundred and Sixty one perches to a Sugar Tree, thence South by Vacant Land one hundred and thirty perches to a Birch Tree, thence West by Lot No. 2169 two hundred and Sixty one perches to an Iron Wood Tree, thence North by Lot No. 2152 one hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning Containing Two Hundred Acres and allowance of Six p Cent for Roads &c. Numbered MMCLXX.

with its appurtenances unto the said *Peter Lunckle* his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Peter Lunckle* his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

Peter Lunckle his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges.
