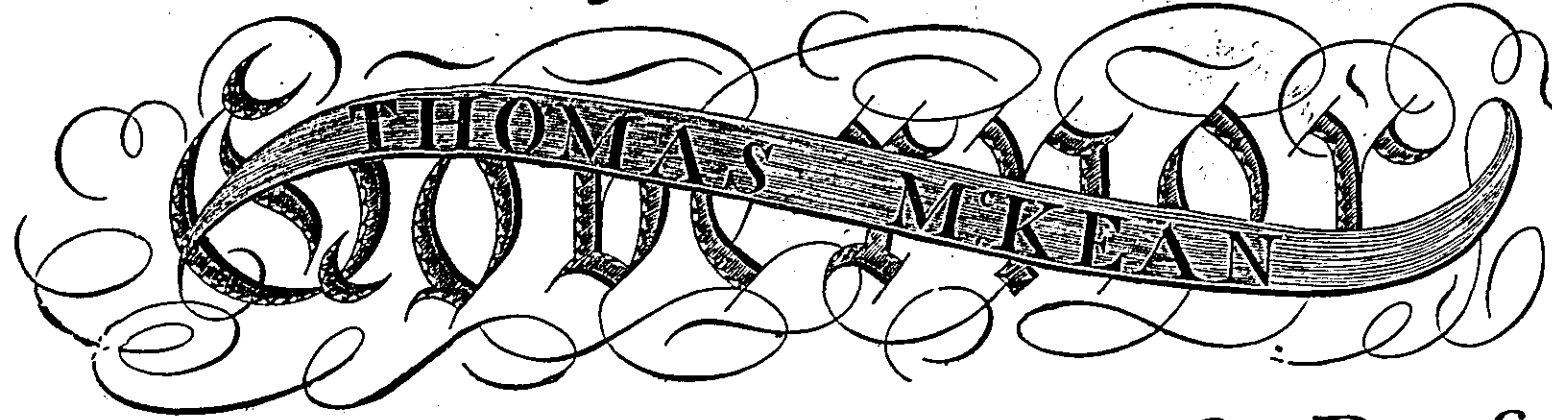

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Now ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Joseph Harrar private in the late Army of the United States and in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Mary Harrar Widow and William Harrar son of the said Joseph Harrar deceased, a certain Tract of land No 254 called "Sligo" situate in Conation District No 2 in Butler County Begirring at a white Oak, thence by lot No 255, East two hundred sixty one perches to a white Oak, thence by lot No 256, South one hundred thirty perches to a quaking Ash, thence by lot No 280, West two hundred sixty one perches to a quaking Ash, and thence by lot No 280, North one hundred thirty perches to the Begirring, containing Two hundred Acres and Allowance of six ft. Cent for roads &c. Which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed the 21th February 1785.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Mary Harrar and William Harrar and their Heirs to the use of them the said Mary Harrar and William Harrar their Heirs and Assigns for ever as Tenants in Common and not as joint Tenants. free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pitts mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these Presents, at Lancaster - this ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three and of the Commonwealth the twenty eighth.
